- All departments: 98, 99, 198, 199, 199RA, provided the course is taken for a letter grade and a “B” or higher is earned.
- Normally, any course (or course group) with an “H” next to the number, provided the “H” refers to honors content. Examples include History 4AH, Geology 2H, Sociology 1 taken concurrently with Sociology 1H, and Classics 40 with Classics 40H.
