Community Service Requirement

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Students planning to complete the College Honors Program and earn the Academic Excellence Award at commencement need to complete volunteer service in addition to meeting GPA and honors units requirements. Students must volunteer for at least ten hours of campus or community service during each of their final two years on campus.

Purpose of the Service Requirement

The College Honors Program believes that exploring the world around you is an essential part of your undergraduate education, which includes activity both inside and outside the classroom. Community service provides a means to expand your intellectual development and diversify your personal experience.
